I started collecting and making miniatures when I was in the fifth grade. My mother had given my sisters and me her dollhouse when I was 6 or 7, and I was the one of four who liked it the most. The dollhouse is a replica of Repton, her father's home in Louisville, which is still standing but no longer in our family. My grandfather's foundry made the cast-iron window and door frames, which hold glass and screw into the Masonite walls, and it sits on a cast-iron wheeled base. The house number is 1937, the year my mother got the house for Christmas, and it was electrified with bulbs in each room and on the front porch even in those long-ago days. (I was always thrilled I didn't need to learn how to wire my dollhouse!) The house was completely furnished with Depression-era furniture and accessories, so incredibly detailed – but when we moved back to the USA from Luxembourg in 1967, we only had seven pieces of furniture left – I think the movers stole everything else!

I've worked on that house off and on for forty years, changing and updatingit, and it's undergoing another redecoration right now. It's travelled with me to Cincinnati, Atlanta, North Carolina and now Louisville, where it was born! When I started in minis, I read "Hobbies" magazine and saved my allowance to buy catalogs from places like Chestnut Hill Studio and Ellen Krucker Blauer. In the 1980's I finally found out about NAME and joined first the Miniature Society of Cincinnati and then the Louisville Miniature Club. I love hanging out with other people who understand what I love to do and enjoy taking classes and sharing ideas and projects with me. NAME Conventions and Houseparties are so much fun, and we're so lucky we can take workshops and have access to great dealers and artisans! The depth and variety of ideas, the skill level and imagination of those I meet every day are so amazing and inspirational!

Being Kentucky's State Rep is my first position with NAME. Nancye Claypool, our LMC Club President and my good friend, asked me to take it on so she could be the Regional Coordinator for A-3. Nancye and I co-chaired the A-3 Jockeys & Juleps Houseparty in 2018 and enjoyed a wonderful event, met so many artisans and enthusiasts and got to show off our fabulous city of Louisville, all at the same time! It was tons of work but also tons of fun, and working with our amazing Committee members and getting to know them was a huge bonus.






