Cleveland Miniaturia Society C-066 48th Annual Miniature Show October 12, 2019









Cleveland Miniaturia Society, Inc. (CMS) was founded in Cleveland in 1976 as a non-profit organization and is a charter member of the National Association of Miniature Enthusiasts (NAME C-066)). It is also the second oldest scale miniature club in the world. CMS is the sponsor of oldest continuous annual dollhouse show and sale in the country. This year's 48th Annual Show was held on Saturday, Oct. 12th. The show is held at the Don Umerley Civic Center, Rocky River, Oh. Members had a variety of miniatures and roomboxes on display. CMS also sponsored a Christmas Tree decorating challenge for its members. Attendees were asked to vote for their favorite tree. The Peoples' Choice Award 1st Place went to Michelle Ningard, 2^{nd} Place went to Neti Semmens and 3^{rd} Place went to Deborah Freeman. Our show had a nice selection of vendors who have repeatedly returned to offer supplies, roomboxes and miscellaneous miniatures to a dedicated following of shoppers from the Cleveland area. Dedicated shoppers have also come from the Pittsburgh area, Toledo and Columbus. Door Prizes and Raffle Prizes were offered throughout the day. A beautiful farmhouse was the Grand Prize. Proceeds from the show will be given to ACBC - Aluminum Cans for Burned Children. ACBC provides fire safety education, a winter & summer camp, a scholarship program and a young adult program. ACBC was founded in 1986 by the Northern Ohio Fire Fighters and the Northeast Ohio Fire Chiefs Association. ACBC & MetroHealth Medical Center have partnered to provide pediatric burn survivors with exceptional ongoing physical and emotional healing & recovery.

Members Lynne Rice, Debra Freeman, Karen Hochradel and Gloria Ebratt brought several roomboxes with a book theme such as "Where the Wild Things Are", "Good Night Moon", "Alice in Wonderland " and a figure of Geppotto & puppet. Other roomboxes and items were displayed that had been completed through IGMA in Castine and at National Houseparties. As a result of our display, CMS was showcased in the local newsletter and persons who had seen the display came to the show as first timers interested in the art of miniatures.

Both E-line and Bon Air also invite a local Train Collectors group to exhibit and we often see the same viewers at both displays. Libraries are traditionally a great partner for miniature clubs and we encourage everyone to ask around about opportunities to exhibit!

One miniaturist - Natalie Harwood - has become well known in her community for her love and artistry in miniatures. 
